

Dear brethren,

Greetings to you all in the precious name of our Savior, Jesus the Christ. Being Christians has been and will always be a great blessing to me and my family. It helps me to see things through better lenses than what is driving majority of people in our Country to hell. This blessing helps me see the love of God greater in my life each day. Knowing God has been the best thing that happens to me. We praise God for seeing us through the month of March. It was the hottest month of the year here in Jos, as the temperature kept rising without rainfall. Most water wells dried up, the city water was no more coming, yet the love of God continued to flow unrestricted. The month went so swiftly as a weaver bird. But we thank God for all that he used us to accomplish during the month of April. The month of April marked end of 6 months dry season in the northern Nigeria, a season which started since October last year. It is unbelievable how God takes care of his creature, especially mankind. Living through the difficult weather is God's providence. Though we complain, yet God is always mindful of us. We owe Him praise.

During the month of April, the young congregation that started last year in Ray Field, Jos, became a year old. Looking back, we can see the hand of God in our lives. During this one year, we were able to organize the first widows' week and victim of violent conflicts. This is the first of its kind in the whole of Plateau State. We were able to reach some vulnerable people. We have shared copies of the Bible tracts, and reading classes to people with eye problems. This we could not have done without your help. The congregation was able to buy a land space through loan I secured. We are paying the money monthly. We have started erecting a temporal structure on the land. Lord's willing, we will just put wooden poles to the ground and put the roofing sheets to shade us from rain and sun. We will worship there to the glory of God, while we get the approval and fund to build the permanent meeting place. Where we meet now for worship and Bible classes is a rented space, but the major problem is the drinking bar that is located next shop to our room. It becomes hard to invite people to worship with us, because the place is not conducive, especially for the children we are trying to form their character.

Here, we have space for the children class, restrooms for male and female, then the meeting hall. Members came out to fill the foundation with red soil.

From the School of Biblical Studies, we have concluded our exams for the semester, and now on evangelism campaign for Christ. The school year is coming to an end this May. During the month of April, we conducted 845 studies with 3,291 prospects. We are currently having 945 ongoing studies. We enrolled 13 prospects in the WBS program. During the month, we gave out

5,379 tracts/pamphlet. God added 3 souls to his church. It is the time of the year that we all go out, both staff and students to different places in the country to spread the Gospel. Keep us in prayer. We know that the open door we have now, may not last forever. Hence, while it is day, let us do the work of him who sent, because night comes when no man can work. During this month of May, the School of Biblical Studies will be having its19th Annual Gospel lectureship. Sad enough, this is coming at a time we are having shortage of Gas in the Country. The price of gas has tripled itself from what was bought in January. In some place, people are buying \$10 for a gallon of gas. This affects the cost of living and movement. Please, pray with us that they should be intervention for the price to drop. People coming to this program, to some extent depends on the availability of Gas at affordable price.

I am glad to mention that the congregations in Mazah Road, Foron Mission and New Foron are equally growing. My joy is the fact that, they are able to stand and defend the Gospel. Over the last 19 years, I have been moving around establishing new congregations in areas where the church was not found. Then the insecurity in the Northern Nigeria started affecting the progress of the work. The congregation in Saminaka died off. But with your prayers and commitment to the work, all other congregations are surviving. The congregation in Toro is doing fine. All these congregations now have their meeting places, except the recent one in Ray Field.

Brethren, this accomplishment would not have been possible without God using you for the work. Sandra and I started working on the children, to ensure that the future of the church is secured. This will continue to give more effort to lead them to Christ while there is still hope. On behalf of my wife and children, we say thank you so much for enabling us do our responsibilities. May God bless you richly.

We pray also for you that, you all may enjoy a hitch free Summer season. Those who will have to travel, may you have accident free trip. May we use the month of May to the Glory of God.
