sinned against heaven and before you. ¹⁹ I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants." ²⁰ And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. ²¹ And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' ²² But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. ²³ And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. ²⁴ For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate.

I know economic situation is bad across the globe, but that of Nigeria calls for real concern. Economically, families are starving, not having access to just a meal a day. We continue to thank God for how far He has brought us. The rain that started well is not continuing in the Northern Nigeria. Many crops planted are now withering off. We still appreciate God because whatever He does, cannot be corrected. In some states in the Country, they only have rain for three months in a year, yet God is still providing for them. God is amazing when we look at his providence and love. The month of May was a busy one for us, especially as the School of Biblical studies rounded up its session. We ended the session and proceeded for campaign evangelism, Gospel lectureship, and graduation of 2024 class. We thank God because he guided and protected us through all of these activities. On behalf of my family, I use this opportunity to appreciate you all for your prayers and sacrificial contributions towards the African Mission. May God Almighty reward you abundantly in his special ways.

From the School of Biblical Studies, we had the graduation of the 2024 class, where 30 men and women (altogether) were sent out to the field. We praise God because he provided the needed protection, for the whole session. We had a hitch free session. Despite the economic challenges, our students were able to finish the semester.

Campaign Evangelism - As part of yearly school activities, each year at the end of final exams, we embark on campaign for Christ in different locations that applied for our teams of evangelists. We work with such congregations knocking doors, studying the Bible with people. Below is a team of our students, getting ready to board a van to Gombe State.



A team of campaigners from SBS: This year, we went to 4 different places in 3 states (Gombe, Kogi, and Benue). There was additional team that remained in Jos to carry out intensive door knocking. The village we went to work in Benue this time is a virgin land. There was no congregation there before we went. To the glory of God, a new congregation is set up there. Preachers from nearby villages agreed to nurture the congregation. Within the one week exercise, we were working day and night as opportunities present themselves. We conducted 997 studies with 4,389 prospects. We conducted open-air preaching, showed movie of Jesus ministry in some of the places, taught Bible studies to the brethren. To the praise of God, 17 souls in all were added to the body of Christ. Please, join in prayers for God to protect these young ones for His use.

Our annual gospel lectureship for this year was a huge success. We had Christians come all over Nigeria and beyond. We had 2 preachers from Niger Republic and 1 from Chad attend the program. We had Randy Baker and Adam Cox from Alabama, attend the program also. We thank God because despite the hike in fuel price during that time, Christians defy the odds and made their way to Jos. We appreciate God also for the journey mercies for each of them that came and had since returned to their families.

The young congregation that started last year in Ray-field, Jos, is growing. We appreciate God providing us with a land. We started putting up a temporal structure for worship. I am glad to mention that we are now roofing the place. Though it is so open, yet, once we fix the floor, we will move in for worship to the glory of God. Where we are meeting now is hazardous, especially to children. We will also be able to hold our children classes alongside the adult class.

It is a remarkable progress, we give thanks to God for his graciousness. The congregation at Mazah road, lost one of her old members. We thank God because even when it was difficult for her to walk, she still came for worship. She was an encouragement to every one of us. Out of her devotion, 3 of her children remain in the church till today.

As God has brought into this month, we pray that His grace be sufficient unto us all in every where, so that we live to glorify Him in every of our decisions and action. I wish you all a wonderful summer season.
