SUNDAY WAS MADE FOR MAN, NOT MAN FOR SUNDAY



12 At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath. His disciples were hungry, and they began to pluck heads of grain and to eat. ² But when the Pharisees saw it, they said to him, "Look, your disciples are doing what is not lawful to do on the Sabbath." ³ He said to them, "Have you not read what David did when he was hungry, and those who were with him: ⁴ how he entered the house of God and ate the bread of the Presence, which it was not lawful for him to eat nor for those who were with him, but only for the priests? ⁵ Or have you not read in the Law how on the Sabbath the priests in the temple profane the Sabbath and are guiltless? ⁶ I tell you, something greater than the temple is here. ⁷ And if you had known what this means, 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the guiltless. ⁸ For the Son of Man is lord of the Sabbath."

⁹ He went on from there and entered their synagogue. ¹⁰ And a man was there with a withered hand. And they asked him, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"—so that they might accuse him. ¹¹ He said to them, "Which one of you who has a sheep, if it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will not take hold of it and lift it out? ¹² Of how much more value is a man than a sheep! So it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath." ¹³ Then he said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." And the man stretched it out, and it was restored, healthy like the other. ¹⁴ But the Pharisees went out and conspired against him, how to destroy him. Matthew 12:1-14

REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 2024 (Tom Ekpot Jr.)

Dear Beloved brethren,

I greet you all in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I hope you all had a peaceful Thanksgiving celebration. We have reasons to thank God even for the things we not know understand clearly why God is acting that way, because His ways are always better than ours. I appreciate God Almighty for His faithfulness in securing us and providing for us daily. I am particularly grateful to Him for seeing me through my two months travels through the States. I was thinking I will be able to get to Ellabell and Washington State during this visit, but things did not work out well. However, I still appreciate God for His mercies. The School of Biblical Studies is planning to become a Christian University in Nigeria. I came around at the invitation of the overseeing elders to talk to supporting congregations. I did not come to the States with Sandra because the United States Embassy denied her traveling VISA. They probably believed if two of us travelled at the same time, we will not return to Nigeria. They do not realize the enormous task I have to do here in Nigeria. Well, since I returned to Nigeria a month ago, I have been trying to catch up both with the work at the school, the congregations, and keeping up with meetings our evangelism prospects. Being a Christian is the best decision one can make, for me is greatest achievement I will say I have made in life.

As soon as I returned to Nigeria, I went to visit the congregation at Foron Mission. The congregation is doing

fine, and growing in faith and number. The picture here was taken on the first Sunday in November, when I worshipped with them. Most of those small children are now teenagers and the teenage children have grown and some have left the village to big cities to make living.

At Rayfield congregation, the Lord has been mindful of us. Being a city congregation, it witnesses the coming and moving out of people. Since the establishment of the congregation in March 2023, many people have been brought to Christ. Some of them have moved to other places, few are still with us. Recently we had Marvelous and Vincent baptized for the remission of their sins. All of them started worshipping immediately after



their conversion. Marvelous is still keeping up with his faith in Christ, learning each day. Marvelous is the one in the picture below. He came from Lagos to visit his father who is our first convert since the establishment of the congregation at Rayfield last year. Well, God has been kind to us, his father is so committed to his faith and is already taking responsibilities in the church. He helps us each Sunday to pick and drop one elderly woman who started worshipping with us. The woman has visual impairment, and needs assistance to the meeting place. Her children are not concerned about her and do not want her to be worshipping with us. The church takes care of the old woman, and have this brother drop her and pick her every Sunday. The woman is not yet a Christian, but we



are studying with her. We believe she will come to the knowledge of the truth soon. Marvelous, the young convert is learning fast from his father's commitment. This is where I see the power of positive influence. The young man is dedicated to know more about God and is willing to be involved in everything in the church.

Vincent is another young convert. The young man was not a member of any religious group for a long time. We reached out to him with the Gospel, he decided to give himself to God. After some weeks of becoming a Christian,

MARVELOUS SMART his family members suddenly are after him. That if he must be

a Christian, he must return to their family church. The young man does not want to worship with denomination, but his family members are pressuring him to revert to their family church. While we keep him in prayers, we have made him to realize that he is accountable to God for his choices. Keep praying for Vincent. In some families, when one decides to leave their belief system, they deprive him of his right to their family inheritance. We know all these are threats to confuse him from following God.

At the School of Biblical Studies, we have ended final exams, many of the students have traveled back to their home congregations, and those on internship have also gone to their places of assignment. We pray the holiday will be peaceful for them and for our staff. Come Saturday 7, December, we will be going to different states to have intensive classes for two weeks with our extension students. These are preachers, leaders, and Bible teachers in local congregations who do not have time to come and

spend time at the School of Biblical Studies in Jos. We therefore carry the training to meet them at their home locations. Keep us in prayers please.

Permit me use this opportunity to appreciate you all for your kindness towards us. Praying for and supporting us. May God keep blessing you all. Last year, we organized the first widows/orphans' day, where we passed out some kilos of rice, yam, and cooking seasoning. We are hopeful to do that this year. We are constrained with money. But we will still reach out to the few our resources can reach. We have 3 widows and 4 orphans with us. Last year, widows from other congregations came too, in addition to victims of armed conflict in Jos. May God be praised in all of these.

I wish you all Merry Christmas in advance. Grace and Peace, Tom Ekpot (Jr)



Here is a fun puzzle for you. There are thirty books of the Bible in this paragraph. Can you find them? This is a most remarkable puzzle. It was found by a gentleman in an airplane seat pocket, on a flight from Los Angeles to Honolulu, keeping him occupied for hours. He enjoyed it so much, he passed it on to some friends. One friend from Illinois worked on this while fishing from his john boat. Another friend studied it while playing his banjo. Elaine Taylor, a columnist friend, was so intrigued by it she mentioned it in her weekly newspaper column.
